SMOOTH SKIES AHEAD: THAI-TURKISH PARTNERSHIP SIGNALS GLOBAL TRAVEL UPSWING



A monumental leap forward for international air travel took flight yesterday when Thai Airways International (THAI) and Turkish Airlines secured a memorandum of understanding. The anticipated partnership will focus on the cut-throat competition prevalent on Asia-Europe routes.

Commonly, airline collaborations entail synchronising schedules and revenue sharing. For instance, Qantas Airways and Emirates have a working partnership on Europe-Australia services. However, these arrangements need the green light from competition regulators in each operator's country.

Apart from enhancing their networks, this alliance would catalyse daily flights between Bangkok and Istanbul, as elucidated by THAI. The announcement of an exact take-off date for the service is aboard for today. On the other hand, Turkish Airlines already facilitates bi-daily travel to Thailand's capital Bangkok.

Despite trailing a challenging path, THAI, currently under court-regulated debt reshaping due to a bankruptcy commitment in 2020, shows signs of recovery.

THAILAND TARGETS LONG-HAUL TOURISTS WITH NEW US, SAUDI ARABIA OFFICES

In an effort to boost tourists visiting, Thailand's government will be establishing additional tourism offices in the United States and Saudi Arabia, stated the deputy spokeswoman Rachada Dhnadirek. The proposition comes as part of a refreshed approach to meet international market demands, as directed by Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha.

The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) is now concentrating on attracting long-haul travellers, primarily from Europe, the United States, and the Middle East. The projected revenue from such endeavours is expected to reach a staggering 1.62 trillion baht by year's end, Dhnadirek pointed out.

RACE IS ON TO CLEAN UP LARGE OIL SPILL

Phuket: At least three tonnes of oil from a slick suspected to have come from a ship, have been removed from Sirinat National Park and Koh Racha Yai after being washed ashore.

The spill is believed to have originated from neighbouring Phangnga province last Wednesday before reaching Koh Racha Yai in Phuket on Sunday.

The environmental impact was also being assessed as the slick posed a threat to 4,000 rai of undersea coral extending from Phangnga to Phuket. Ms. Pornsri said officials were examining sea areas as well as marine creatures affected by the slick.

TOURISM PUTS ITS FAITH IN PHEU THAI

Tourism operators are hopeful a government can be formed by Pheu Thai as the party has a track record of governing, with the sector eager for state measures to continue effective tourism policies and eliminate ongoing obstacles.

The president of the Association of Thai Travel Agents (Atta), said a Pheu Thai coalition government could be formed because the party has experience leading the country and a track record of improving the economy. He said such a government could encourage more economic growth than military-backed governments did in previous decades. Mr. Sisdivachr said he believes such a government would prioritise economic policies, including making tourism a major growth engine. Based on the track record of Pheu Thai's past administration, he said there were projects that helped with tourism promotion and should be reintroduced, such as marketing the Chinese movie Lost in Thailand, which created a buff for Thai tourism among travelers from the mainland.

LIFESAVING TRAINING PROGRAM COURSE 3



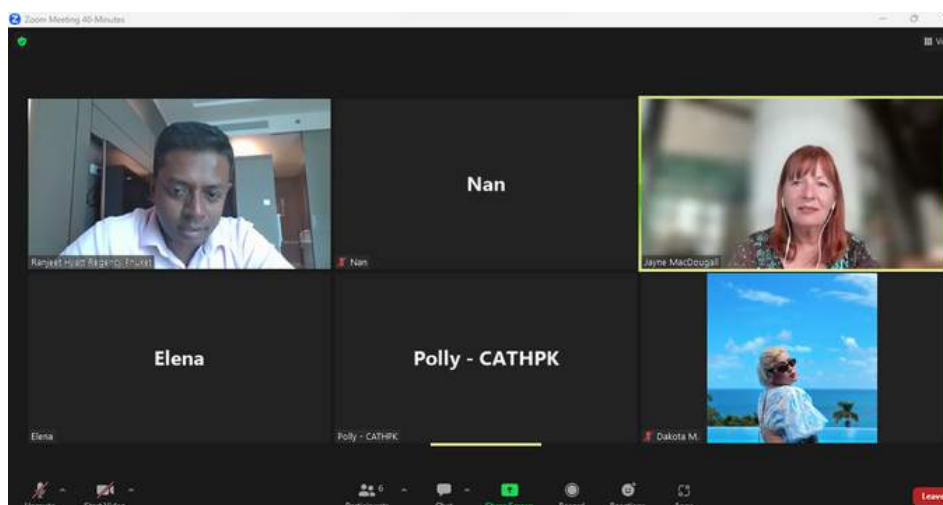
